Sunday Bible Study Session 2 – December 7, 2014 "A Dark Hour in Israel" – (Revelation 11:4)

Read Revelation 11:1-11.

TWO WITNESSES:

- <u>Verse 1</u> John is given a reed (a surveyor's instrument to measure).
 - 1. Measure the TEMPLE
 - 2. Measure the ALTAR
 - 3. Measure the worshipping ones
- Verse 2 Leave out the court (the place where the Gentiles could come). This is saying that in the last ½ of the Tribulation, the Gentiles would run Jerusalem. The dictator of the Revived Roman Empire is actually the ruler of Jerusalem his image is in the temple, in the Holy of Holies. Read Luke 21:24. These two witnesses will be preaching this entire 3 ½ years, minus two weeks (42 months is 3 ½ years Minus 2 weeks). In those two weeks they are killed, resurrected and then taken to Heaven.
- <u>Verse 3</u> "They shall prophesy" that's their ministry the preaching ministry of the two witnesses wearing "sackcloth", preaching every single day.
- <u>Verse 4</u> Analogy: Zechariah 4 God raised up the prophet to stir the spiritual leaders. God gave him 10 visions, all in one night (<u>Note the study of the Ten Visions of Zechariah</u>).
- <u>Verse 5</u> Protection and provision of these two witnesses.
- Verse 6 God's Power at work.
- Verses 7-9 Death of the two witnesses (World-wide coverage).
- Verse 10 CHRISTMAS FOR SATAN.
- Verse 11, 12 A GREAT SURPRISE (RESURRECTION AND ASCENSION of the two witnesses).
- Verse 13 JUDGMENT THE SAME HOUR.
- <u>Verse 14</u> THIRD WOE 6TH TRUMPET = BAPTISM OF FIRE.

Sunday Bible Study Session 2 – December 7, 2014 (Continued) "A Dark Hour in Israel" – (Revelation 11:4)

ZECHARIAH'S VISIONS (Zechariah 1:7-6:8):

Revelation 11:4 "two Olive trees - two candlesticks"

In the Old Testament, the emphasis is on Zerrubbabel (Governor-head and representative of the Royal house of David) and Joshua (High Priest-from the tribe of Levi) Family of Aaron; the High Priest is presented in Zechariah 3:1-8.

In the New Testament, the "two Olive Trees" represent Moses and Elijah.

VISIONS

- 1. Horseman among the myrtle trees (Zechariah 1:7-17)
- 2. Four horns and four craftsmen (1:18-21)
- 3. The surveyor (2:1-13)
- 4. Joshua/Satan (3:1-10)
- 5. Golden Lampstand / two olive trees (4:1-14)
- 6. Flying scroll (<u>5:1-4</u>)
- 7. Woman in the Ephah (basket $-\frac{5:5-11}{}$)
- 8. 4 Chariots (<u>6:1-8</u>)

VISIONS EXPLAINED

- A call for Israel to Repent
- God's Plan for Israel-Jerusalem and the Temple
- Coming of the Future Messiah
- 1. "...Horseman among myrtle trees" (Zechariah 1:7-17) The angel tells the prophet that God still loves Israel, and would restore Jerusalem (Verse 17).
- 2. "4 horns / 4 craftsmen" (1:18-21) The horns represent the 4 kingdoms that opposed Israel (Assyria, Egypt, Babylon, and Medo-Persia). The craftsmen will "throw down their horns" God defeats Israel's enemies.
- 3. The surveyor (2:1-13) holds a measuring line God's promise that Jerusalem will be expanded, and its people will one day live in safety, as the Lord judges Israel's enemies.

Sunday Bible Study Session 2 – December 7, 2014 (Continued) "A Dark Hour in Israel" – (Revelation 11:4)

- 4. Joshua the high priest (3:1-10) in filthy clothes Satan is there, and is rebuked. Joshua then is given rich, clean, clothes. A beautiful symbol of Israel's restoration as God's "Priestly nation" (Exodus 19:6). Note: the ultimate High Priest is Jesus Christ, the Branch.
- 5. "...Golden lampstand and two olives trees" (4:1-14). Two olive trees feed the golden lampstand. God provides for His own.
- 6. "...Flying scroll" (5:1-4) written on both sides, flying over the land Speaks of God's Judgment on those who disobey.
- 7. "...Woman in the basket" (5:5-11) An ephah is 3/5 of a bushel, with a lead cover. The angel opens, then seals, with the heavy cover. Two other women appear with stork-like wings pick up the basket and carry it to Babylon which is a strange picture of WICKEDNESS to be banished to Babylon (Revelation 17).
- 8. "...Four chariots" (6:1-8) Zechariah sees 4 horses, of different colors, pulling 4 chariots. This must be a picture of judgment upon the enemies of Israel (1st 4 seals), and then "REST" comes (Revelation 6:1-8). As Israel returns to Jerusalem and rebuilds the temple, they will find God's favor. "...Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the LORD ALMIGHTY". –Zechariah 4:6
