ANTI-SEMITISM In the Age of Israel

Genesis 12:2-3

DEFINITION

Anti-Semitism: Hostility toward, opposition to, prejudice against, or intolerance of the Jewish people.

- ANTI = against; in opposition to.
- SEMITIC from "Shem", middle son of Noah & ancestor of all Semitic races.

DESCENDENTS OF SHEM

MODERN DAY SEMITES: Jews, Armenians, Syrians, some Ethiopians and Somalis, many Egyptians, and Arabs.

Arabs include Saudis, people of Qatar, Yemen, Oman, the Arab Emirates, Kuwait, and the Palestinians.

ANCIENT SEMITES: Assyrians, Chaldeans, Moabites, Ammonites, Midianites, Amalekites, and many others.

GENESIS 12:2-3

"And I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great; and so you shall be a blessing; and I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

ANTI-SEMITISM In the Age of Israel (Continued)

Genesis 12:2-3

SATAN'S STRATEGY:

- 5. The Syrians Isaiah 7:5-7
- 6. The Phoenicians 1 Kings 16:31-33; Ezekiel 26-27
- 7. The Philistines The Books of Judges; Samuel; Kings; Chronicles; Zechariah 9:5-7
- 8. The Seleucids A remnant of the Grecian empire of Alexander the Great, destroyed in 64 BC by the Romans.
- 9. The Romans 64 BC 70 AD.
 - The Gospels, and the Book of Acts
 - Delivered the 5th cycle of discipline to the nation of Israel in 70 AD
