## MANIFESTATION OF THE BRIDE

- I. The body of Christ is being formed on the earth during the Church Age and is to be completed before the Rapture (<u>Ephesians 1:20, 23; 2:16; 4:4, 5; 5:23</u>, and <u>Colossians 1:18; 1:24; 2:19</u>).
- II. When the body is completed then the Rapture will occur. This is the Resurrection of the Body of Christ (<u>I Thessalonians 4:16-18</u>; <u>I Corinthians 15:51-57</u>). Compare Colossians 2:15 and Revelation 19:6-8 with Zechariah 13:2 and I Thessalonians 3:13; it appears that the number of believers in the body of Christ will be equal to the number of demons operating under the command of Satan a time of intensified conflict.
- III. During the tribulation on earth, the Bride is to be prepared for the Wedding in Heaven. There are 3 parts to this preparation of the Bride:
  - 1. The Bride enters into ultimate sanctification by receiving the Resurrection Body (<a href="https://philippians.3:21">Philippians 3:21; I John 3:1, 2</a>).
  - 2. Secondly, the bride will lose the Old Sinful Nature (OSN) No OSN in the Resurrection Body (<a href="Philippians 3:21">Philippians 3:21</a>).
  - 3. The Bride is cleansed from Works of the Flesh (I Corinthians 3:12, 15).
- IV. The wedding then occurs at the end of the tribulation-and the Bride returns with the LJC at the Second Advent (I Thessalonians 3:13).
- V. At this time, we have *Footstool Operation*, prophesized in Psalm 110:1, which includes 3 things:

- 1. A triumphal procession, in which all demons are disarmed by Jesus Christ, followed by this public procession (Colossians 2:15).
- 2. Satan, the ruler of this world is removed (Revelation 20:1-3).
- 3. Church Age believers will cast demons off the earth into their own prison (Zechariah 13:2; Colossians 2:15; I Corinthians 15:24, 25).
- VI. The event is the Coronation of the Groom (Revelation 19:6).
- VII. Then will occur the Wedding Supper of the Lamb (<u>Revelation 19:6-9</u>). Please note the Wedding Concept of the Ancient world:
  - 1. First, there was a contract (engagement).
  - 2. Then on a specified day the groom would go to the house of the Bride and pick her up.
  - 3. From there he goes to his home where his friends are already inside-eating and drinking.
  - 4. Her friends, as was the custom, were all outside waiting (Friends of the Bride could not enter until the Bride entered).
  - 5. This means that the friends of the groom had a head start.
  - 6. ANALOGY
    - A. The Groom is the Lord Jesus Christ
    - B. Friends of the Groom are Old Testament saints (<u>John 3:29</u>).
    - C. The Bride = Church Age believers.
    - D. The Friends of the Bride = the tribulational believers, and those alive at the  $2^{nd}$  Advent (<u>Matthew 25:1-3; Revelation 19:6</u>).
