## **REVELATION 7:9 - Notes:**

- 1. Chapter 7 is the middle of a parenthetical passage.
- 2. There are 6 Seals presented previously, in Chapter 6 (verses 1, 2, 3, 7, 9, and 12)
- 3. Chapter 7 is inserted into the narrative to allow us to catch a glimpse of God's Grace, during a horrible time on the earth.
- 4. The Rapture does not spell the end of people being saved (He came to save sinners <u>I Timothy 1:15</u> and <u>John 6:37</u> reveal that He *does not* cast out those who come to Him; also <u>2 Peter 3:9</u> "The Lord is not slack...").
- 5. In <u>Revelation 7:1-8</u> we see the Lord redeeming 144,000 Jewish men to go out into the entire world to preach the Gospel.
- 6. Now we see their converts described: "a vast number that no one could number."
  - (1) NUMBER John makes no attempt to declare the number.
    - 3,000 saved on the day of Pentecost Acts 2:41; later 5,000, Acts 4:4; "the Lord added daily" Acts 2:47
    - > 1 million were saved in Nineveh.
    - Perhaps as many as 3 Million in Egypt, when the blood was placed on the doorposts by faith. Exodus 12:1-13
  - (2) NATIONALITIES "all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues." (No racial, economic, social or national distinctions Gentiles saved by Grace.)
  - (3) NATURES This is not the Church, because they are "standing". When the Church is shown in Heaven, they are sitting (Revelation 4:4).
    - ➤ This crowd is "standing" (vs. 13-14); they came from the "Great Tribulation". The Church does not go through the Tribulation I Thessalonians 1:10; Romans 5:9; Revelation 3:10.
    - ➤ These people are described as VIRTUOUS "clothed with white robes" (Imputed Righteousness). VICTORIOUS These redeemed saints have palm branches in their hands (a symbol of Victory over sin, Satan and the power of the Antichrist).
    - ➤ These saints lift their voices in an anthem of Praise to their Redeemer for His redemption. We will see that in Revelation 7:10, 11.
