WATER OF LIFE – REDEMPTION

Presented in many different ways throughout the Scriptures:

"In that day a fountain shall be opened for the house of David and for the inhabitants of Jerusalem, for sin and for uncleanness". (Zech. 13:1)These are the wells of salvation of which Isaiah spoke about in Isa. 12:3. The water of life is only available from God, the fountain of life (Ps.36:6). He is the "fountain of living waters". (Jer.2:13) In the wilderness wandering, Moses struck the rock (representing Christ, I Cor.10:4) from which life-giving waters came forth, (Ex.17:6) The promise of redemption by the Holy Spirit is compared to life-giving water (Isa.44:3; John 7:37-39).

(Read John 4:10-14)

Those coming out of the Great Tribulation were led by the Lamb to living fountains of waters (Rev.7:14). During the Millennium, living water will flow from the Millennial Temple. (Ezek. 47:1, 8-9; Joel 3:18; Zec.14:8). A pure river of water of life flows from the throne of God and the Lamb in the New Jerusalem. (Rev.22:1ff) The final invitation given by the Spirit and the bride in the book of Revelation is to take the water of life freely. Rev. 22:17ff

Because Redemption is so costly, only God could pay the price. The price was the death of His Son (Rev.1:18ff). It was the Lamb who redeemed (ἀγοράζω), purchased sinners from the slave market of sin. The price has been paid in full and no person can add to the finished work. "Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat. Yes, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." (Isa.55:1)

THIS IS THE GREAT DIFFERENCE BETWEEN RELIGION AND RELATIONSHIP.

Religion looks in the puny self-efforts of mankind, to find something of value to present to God. *NO JUSTIFICATION THERE!*

Relationship sees man's inability and turns totally to the GRACE and MERCY OF GOD. A REMEDY ALREADY PROVIDED.

A FREE, COSTLY GIFT - WITHOUT COST TO US - SHOULD NOT BE REFUSED!

IT IS AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO ARE THIRSTY! IT IS AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO COME TO HIM.
