ZECHARIAH'S VISIONS OF THE TRIBULATION

ZECHARIAH 1:7-6:8 (See Related Study: <u>Analogy of the Two Witnesses of Revelation 4</u>)

Revelation 11:4 "two Olive trees – two candlesticks"

In the Old Testament, the emphasis is on Zerrubbabel (Governor-head and representative of the Royal house of David) and Joshua (High Priest-from the tribe of Levi) Family of Aaron; the High Priest is presented in Zechariah 3:1-8.

In the New Testament, the "two Olive Trees" represent Moses and Elijah.

- 1. Horseman among the myrtle trees (Zechariah 1:7-17)
- 2. Four horns and four craftsmen (1:18-21)
- 3. The surveyor (2:1-13)
- 4. Joshua/Satan (3:1-10)
- 5. Golden Lampstand / two olive trees (4:1-14)
- 6. Flying scroll (<u>5:1-4</u>)
- 7. Woman in the Ephah (basket $-\frac{5:5-11}{}$)
- 8. 4 Chariots (<u>6:1-8</u>)

ZECHARIAH'S VISIONS OF THE TRIBULATION (Continued)

VISIONS EXPLAINED (Expanded):

- 1. "...Horseman among myrtle trees" (Zechariah 1:7-17) The angel tells the prophet that God still loves Israel, and would restore Jerusalem (Verse 17).
- 2. "4 horns / 4 craftsmen" (1:18-21) The horns represent the 4 kingdoms that opposed Israel (Assyria, Egypt, Babylon, and Medo-Persia). The craftsmen will "throw down their horns" God defeats Israel's enemies.
- 3. The surveyor (2:1-13) holds a measuring line God's promise that Jerusalem will be expanded, and its people will one day live in safety, as the Lord judges Israel's enemies.
- 4. Joshua the high priest (3:1-10) in filthy clothes Satan is there, and is rebuked. Joshua then is given rich, clean, clothes. A beautiful symbol of Israel's restoration as God's "Priestly nation" (Exodus 19:6). Note: the ultimate High Priest is Jesus Christ, the Branch.
- 5. "...Golden lampstand and two olives trees" (4:1-14). Two olive trees feed the golden lampstand. God provides for His own.
- 6. "...Flying scroll" (5:1-4) written on both sides, flying over the land Speaks of God's Judgment on those who disobey.
- 7. "... Woman in the basket" (5:5-11) An ephah is 3/5 of a bushel, with a lead cover. The angel opens, then seals, with the heavy cover. Two other women appear with stork-like wings pick up the basket and carry it to Babylon which is a strange picture of WICKEDNESS to be banished to Babylon (Revelation 17).
- 8. "...Four chariots" (6:1-8) Zechariah sees 4 horses, of different colors, pulling 4 chariots. This must be a picture of judgment upon the enemies of Israel (1st 4 seals), and then "REST" comes (Revelation 6:1-8). As Israel returns to Jerusalem and rebuilds the temple, they will find God's favor. "...Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the LORD ALMIGHTY". –Zechariah 4:6
