## **ELECTION**

- 1. All members of the human race are *potentially* elected by unlimited atonement. Jesus Christ is elected from the eternal ages past (Isaiah 42:1; I Peter 2:6, Ephesians 1:4, II Thessalonians 2:13; I Peter 1:2).
  - a. <u>Definition of Election</u>: The sovereign act of God whereby for His Own glory, and through His Own grace, He elected the Son to go to the cross (Acts 2:22-24), and also elected mankind to be saved.
  - b. God is satisfied with the Son (I Peter 2:6).
  - c. Jesus is elected, selected by the Father; this election took place before man existed (Ephesians 1:4, II Thessalonians 2:13, I Peter 1:2).
- 2. This election is both the present and the future possession of every born-again believer (Col. 3:12).
- 3. Every believer shares in the election of Christ (Romans 8:28-33). Because of the Cross, and because of our acceptance of Christ, we have positional sanctification, and share a union with Christ. Since we share the *election* of Christ, we share the *destination* of Christ. Therefore we have the promise in Romans 8:28.
- 4. Election takes place at the moment of salvation (I Cor. 1:9, 23-28; II Thess. 2:13; I Timothy 1:9).
- 5. Election is the foundation of the Church (I Thess. 1:4 born again).
- 6. Election has a purpose in time. Why are we in union with Christ and left on this earth? Because of God's purpose in time for our election (Gal. 1:15; Eph. 1:4; Gal. 5:8). Because in His absence, every person born into God's Kingdom represents the Lord Jesus Christ during the time of His absence.

We as believers are God's witnesses; we are His representation. Note John 17:2, 6, 9-12, 24, where we can see that God has presented us as a gift to the Lord Jesus Christ, His Son.
