Pastor-Teacher

THE GIFT

- 1. The gift of apostle and prophet are temporary gifts.
- 2. The gift of evangelist and pastor-teacher carry the church to the Rapture.
- 3. The gift of pastor-teacher is a "hyphenated gift", because one definite article serves both "pastors" and "teachers", while the conjunction "and" acts as a hyphen. (Two words are employed, but only one idea is intended. This is called a "hendiadys" pronunciation: hen 'dīədəs.
- 4. The word "pastor" means shepherd, and metaphorically refers to the one who is in charge of a flock of sheep.
- 5. The second noun, "teachers", emphasizes the individual pastor's number one priority as a leader namely, to lead the sheep to spiritual nourishment. (John 21:15-17)
- 6. The thrust of this gift is to equip the Royal Family to carry out the various aspects of the ministry, to bring perceptive volition to maturity. (Eph. 4:12, 13)

II. SYNONYMS

- 1. Messenger-(ἀγγελός), a spokesman for God to the local church. (Rev. 2:1 ,8, 12, 18; 3:1, 7,14)
- 2. Minister-(διάκονος, δοῦλος), a servant to perceptive volition. (Mark 10:43, 44; I Cor. 3:5)
- 3. Teacher-(διδάσκαλος), the pastor's responsibility to communicate the contents of scripture. (I Tim. 2:7; 2 Tim. 1:11)
- 4. Bond-slave-(δοῦλον) the pastor is to obey God and trust Him in all aspects of his ministry. (Lk. 12:43; Rom. 1:1; 2 Tim. 2:24; Titus 1:1)

Pastor-Teacher (Continued)

- 5. Overseer-(ἐπίσκοπος), the Pastor is to watch over the general welfare of the flock (Acts 20:28; I Tim. 3:2)
- 6. Heralds (κῆρυξ), (I Tim. 2:7) clearly and emphatically declare God's Word, no matter the response. (2 Pet. 2:5)-(κήρυκα) (verb occurs 61 times)
- 7. Shepherd (π οιμένος), a pastoral metaphor. (John 10:2; Eph. 4:11)
- 8. Elder-(πρεσβύτερος), a word of Jewish origin indicating respect believers are to show spiritual leaders. (I Pet. 5:1, 5; 2 John 1; 3 John 1)

III. STEPS TO THE PASTORATE

- 1. God the Holy Spirit bestows the gift at Salvation. (I Tim. 3:1; Eph. 3:7) A gift to males. (I Tim. 2:12; I Cor.14:34)
- 2. Gift recognition comes with normal spiritual growth.
- 3. Preparation "Timothy Principle". (2 Tim. 2:2)
- 4. Ordination by a local church upon having met the qualifications necessary to assume the office. (I Tim. 5:22; 3:1-7,10)
- 5. God the Holy Spirit brings flock and minister together, (Acts 20:28) and until such time, God will put the minister on "hold" to test and prepare him.
